List of 3,529 members of Trinity College, Dublin, the Dublin University O.T.C., or employees who served in the Great War. List gives date of graduation or entry to the College, ranks with dates appointed, regiments or services, decorations and, if they died, where.

### **3 = de Ruvigny's Roll of Honour**

A biographical record of members of naval and military forces who fell in the Great War 1914 – 1918. Its 1,400+ pages contain the biographies of well over 25,000 men of the army, navy and air force who gave their lives, nearly 7,000 of the entries being accompanied by a photograph. Photo of Lt. F. L. Dobbin in Vol 5. He was killed in the third Anglo-Afghan War, not the Great War.
