AT THIS PLACE

On the night of January 7th, 1921 following an attack on the R.I.C. Barracks at Tramore, four lorries of British troops were ambushed by I.R.A. forces. Two Republican soldiers, Michael McGrath Waterford, and Thomas O'Brien Dunhill, fell in the course of the action. A shrine to their memory was erected here, and was unveiled on March 1922 by Cathal Brugha Dail Representative for Waterford and Republican Minister of Defence.

Falling into disrepair, the shrine was dismantled and the present shrine was erected on its site by the Waterford National Graves Association.

It was unveiled on Easter Sunday 1947 by Mrs Cathal Brugha, and is dedicated to the memory of all the East wWaterford Republican soldiers who laid down Their lives in their country's cause, between the years 1916 and 1923. Their names appear on the scrolls herein.
