**WHERE THE COMMODORE AND OFFICERS OF THE FLEET ON THAT STATION
ERECTED A TABLET TO HIS MEMORY.**

DIED AT BEECHWOOD AUSTRALIA 12TH MAY 1854 AGED 18 YEARS

HIS REMAINS LIE INTERRED AT BEECHWORTH

WHERE HIS COMMANDING OFFICER AND COMRADES

IN WHICH FORCE HE WAS SERVING AS A CADET

ERECTED A TABLET AS A TOKEN OF THE AFFECTION
